Last year at this time I attempted to forecast some of the stories that we would be following in 2015, and now one year later, it is encouraging to see where the Lord has brought us in several areas. This annual report should tell much of the story.

Preaching the Word

We called 2015 the year of David. That is because we studied the life of David through the eyes of the historian who wrote 1 and 2 Samuel. The Scripture Study notes that accompanied the series enhanced all who followed along privately and in Life Groups.

Looking forward to 2016 we begin the year with a break from an expository series on a book of the Bible in order to address the theme of equipping (cf. Ephesians 4:12).

Then, from mid-April to August, we will return to an expositional series on the Life of Christ as told in the Gospel of John. In September we will continue in the Old Testament where we left off, as David passes the Kingdom on to his son Solomon (1 Kings).

Experiencing LeaderShift

During 2015 the Staff and Board of our Church read *Experiencing LeaderShift*, by Don Cousins. There were a number that studied the book more in depth, plus we had the privilege of Don joining us for a few days of Seminar in May which underlined the need we have to apply the principles he teaches.

Going forward into 2016 the Board and the Staff have decided to re-visit this book and give it wider exposure in our Church family. We hope to provide many opportunities to preach, teach and put into practice the Scriptural truths central to being a serving, equipping church that reflects the love of Christ in this world.

Overseeing Staff

I have enjoyed growing as a lead pastor and I consider it a privilege to work with and oversee an awesome staff. I am also humbled by and grateful for various people within and outside of our church family that continue to teach me much about leadership.

Once again we have been blessed by the staff of our church; Pastor Doug Friesen in his ministry of discipleship, Pastor Kevin Klassen in his worship leading and care ministry, Grace Elke in her direction of our

Children's Ministry and Kathy Kornelsen in her Office Administration. As well, Heather Warkentin continues to inform and engage our congregation in service opportunities, and Krista Wynne coordinates the team that leads our Middle School Ministry for Grades 5 - 9.

Each one of these staff members carries out their responsibilities with love for God and for you His people. They are capable in ministry, selfless in attitude and valuable team players. I would ask for your continued prayer and support as we grow to understand what God requires of us in both equipping and serving among you.

Last year in the annual report I had asked you to pray for a new position opening as we began our search for a Pastor of Student Ministries. Within months a Search Committee was formed. Thank you to Dave Barton (Chair), Krista Wynne, Emily Walker and Tim McDaniel for being a super-team. And thanks be to God for leading us to Pastor Kevin Schular. In the short four months he has been with us he has become a great blessing and valuable team player. His passion for the Lord and for ministry to youth is evident. We ask you to uphold him, Jill, Ava and Malachi in prayer.

#### Meaningful Partnerships

In keeping with our mission statement, developing partnerships is an important way of doing ministry in our world. Praise God for the meaningful relationships we have with the leadership of Far Corners Ministry (Shant & Ginny Manuel, Shakti Basumata), Canadian Baptist Ministries (Bruno & Kathleen Soucy, Patti Nacho), Pathway Camp Ministries (Rick & Elizabeth Greer), Camp Nutimik (Peter & Darlene Berg, Shawn & Kerry Quinton), Living Bible Explorers (Mark Henkelman) and our own NAB Missionary partners (Elsie Lewandowski, Nick & Iris Hung, Lyndell & Paulo Campbell Requia). We see other partnerships developing as well, such as Youth for Christ (Katy Hollander).

Pastor Doug's role has been expanded to include Outreach as well as Discipleship, so he and Heather Warkentin are going to be key links with these and other ministries. This will include relationships in the Whyte Ridge Community as well.

This past summer we had several people from our church involved in mission trips and camps, more than ever before. John and Wendy Bergmann led a team of 14 to Garden Hill, Pat and I led a team of 12 to Bolivia (plus the Klassens who were on sabbatical), there were 10 people that served at Camp Nutimik this past summer, and several from our congregation that helped out with our own *'Adventures at the Ridge'* under the leadership of Sonia Wilson, our Summer Student Worker. Thank you for supporting our missions and local ministries.

Praise God that a good percentage of our annual budget goes externally to ministries beyond WRBC.

A personal highlight for Pat and me was being able to go to Bolivia with several others from our church and show them the world that meant so much to our family during our missionary years. We look forward to how God will use this partnership in the years ahead.

### Serving Together

Though so many serve in significant ways, there are a number among us that coordinate and facilitate service for others. I want to mention a few of them right now. Of course Heather Warkentin works formally as our *Service Opportunities Coordinator*. If you are interested in serving she is a good person to speak with. George Giesbrecht continues to chair the Fellowship Committee (Tom & Cynthia Suffield, John & Helga Stubel, Wayne & Carla Litke, Richard & Marilyn Giesbrecht, Debbie Giesbrecht, Irene Toews, Karl & Tina Wagenaar). They hosted and served at many church functions this past year; perhaps the biggest being our Christmas Banquet. Big thanks to all of you!! George is also the coach of our church hockey team - the Whyte Ridge Wings! It has become a good connection point for many in our church.

Al Donald served as our Facilities Coordinator for several years and has recently retired from this position, though he continues in an advisory capacity. Big thanks to Al! He is being replaced by Phil Nikkel, who in addition to overseeing the facility has his sights set on preparing the 201 Scurfield property for sale as we look toward a new building. The other key men that have served us well in this area are Wayne Litke, Bogdan Dryjski and Gerald Owzarek. These guys are such a blessing to us all!

English Conversation Circles have been a key place to connect with our immigrant community as a Church and several great friendships have been formed that have opened the door to Bible Studies and faith conversations. Rosalie Olson and Tom Suffield have been key equippers in this ministry and along with them we thank those from our congregation who have served at ECC. We have had a lot of fun! Please pray as we consider the future direction of this ministry.

### Year of Grief

The past year has been a most difficult year of loss in our church family. We have had several precious members pass on to the glorious presence of Christ, and though there is sweet consolation in our faith, the absence of loved ones leaves a deep void. God has used this year to mature us in caring for one another. GriefShare led by Lorraine déMonye has been a place of refuge for several in this season. The deacons are also growing in their capacity to provide care under Pastor

Kevin's leadership. I think all of us have been touched in some way by the departures of 2015 and they are meant to shape us to be more compassionate. This is something I have taken from the past year.

### Year of Growth

The coming year is full of hope. It is as bright as the promises of God. He is with us and we can see His Spirit preparing our church for service as we discover the zone of His anointing on our lives and step out to obey Him in His strength. It is also an important year of stewardship as we seek to do all that God asks us to do with all that He has given us. Last year I wrote in my report - *This is the year we must come to a holy consensus about whether or not it is the Lord Jesus leading us to move forward with the building....*

In November the decision was made to take the next step forward and the coming months will reveal further steps forward in faith. It is important that we continue to use this building project as a reminder to keep our eyes on Christ and what He is making of us His people. As the Apostle Paul writes, *'In Him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by His Spirit.'* (Eph. 2:22)

As I conclude my report, let me invite you to pray the following prayer with me as we enter this year of possibility in Christ.

*Gracious and loving God, it is with thankfulness that we hear your call to become Christ-like. Something deep within our hearts stirs from its heavy slumber. The memory of something we were to have been, but are not, yet could still be, flits on the fringes of our consciousness. O Loving God, stir up this hunger in our hearts until it becomes the all-consuming passion of our lives. For Jesus' sake. Amen.*

### **Moderator's Report David Wynne**

Wow, what a year. As we moved forward with the "regular" process of "doing church", we continued to build our relationships with Somang Presbyterian Church and the Before and After School Program and continued to reach out to our community and schools. Our church is busy and occupied almost continually and demonstrates a church family serving God. Well done you good and faithful servants.

We continued to move forward cautiously on looking at building and in May our consultants, the NAB (North American Baptist) Foundation conducted a feasibility study of a segment of our population to determine if we had the will and the resources to move forward with building. Their observations and recommendations were that there was

overwhelming support for relocating the church and that we should proceed but at a smaller level than we had envisioned. But the response was not without concerns and the leadership continues to address those concerns. Some, like the addition of a youth pastor, have been addressed. Others, like the ability to handle the debt associated with building are still being assessed to ensure that we do not put ourselves into a position that impacts our ability to continue to serve God. The result of the feasibility study was that our Building Committee went back to the drawing board and reduced the footprint of the new building to bring it in line with the recommendation from the report.

The three committees that were formed to oversee and address the needs for a new building were established by the Board and given the responsibility to look at the needs and bring recommendations to the Board on how to proceed. The Prayer Committee, chaired by Tim Hague, has been keeping our process before God and working with and encouraging our people to continue to seek God's will in how we move forward. They continue to be the committee that is the foundation on which we build and they have carried us forward quietly and efficiently, keeping us before God and accountable to Him. The Building Committee, chaired by Chris Karam, has been the busiest because much of their work needed to be done for the feasibility study and to allow us to make decisions on how and when to move forward. Having completed their revisions from the feasibility study, they have shared the plans with the congregation and will now proceed with the more detailed plans and architectural design. The Capital Funds Committee, chaired by John Wiltshire, has been limited in what they could do but it was their responsibility to work with our consultant and set up the feasibility study. The significant part of their responsibilities will be to run the capital funds drive and assess our ability to borrow and repay the debt. The Board is very appreciative of the efforts and effectiveness of these committees and could not have progressed to where we are at without them.

As a result of all these people and with God's blessing, the Board made a recommendation at our November General Meeting to approve the expenditure of funds and proceed with architectural drawing, site evaluation and City of Winnipeg approvals and the recommendation was approved unanimously. Again, I thank you for your faithfulness and support of our leadership.

One other issue that came out of the feasibility study was a concern for our governance model. Our current model allows us to respond much quicker to issues or changes happening around us because the pastors are now allowed to make those decisions as long as it is within our policy guidelines and budget. And our policy states that the Board speaks with one voice meaning that no individual Board member can give directions to the staff without the approval of the whole Board.

This also allows the Board to focus on how the church should move forward and to plan along with the pastors. And it means that the operational functions of the church are directed by those who know it best.

Over the past couple of years, the Board has supported leadership development through a course of study called LeaderShift and we brought Don Cousins in last year to help us continue to develop leaders within our church. This past November the Board, together with the pastors and staff, got together for a retreat to share and study how we can use LeaderShift to help our people draw closer to God and find their “zone of God’s anointing” in which to serve. We will continue to encourage you and try to provide ways in which you can find your place within WRBC to be involved and energized in your service.

This past June, Tony Naim made the decision to step down as a Board member due to conflicts with his work schedule. We appreciated having Tony at the table with us and hope that he returns as a Board member when his schedule permits. At present you are represented by Shelly Cumming (Church Clerk), Trudy Patzer (who was just re-elected), Dave Barton (Chair of Finance), Anthony Dyck (Chair of Deacons), Carla Litke (elected to replace Tony) and Chris Schroeder. When we have asked for your prayers to support us in our decisions you have responded well and we appreciate having your backing and support. We will continue to try and make decisions that glorify God and continue to build and move our church forward.

This is an exciting time for us as a church. We will continue to seek God’s will in the decisions that we make so that we keep our focus on serving Him. I look forward to serving together with you so that He may be glorified.

### **Associate Pastor of Relationally Based Discipleship**

This is now my 18<sup>th</sup> annual report for our Whyte Ridge Baptist Church family . . . how time flies! And how important it is for us to make wise use of such a precious commodity that God has given us to praise Him with. As I reflect on the time we were given in 2015, I recognize many things to thank God for as He led us closer to Him, and to each other, and that impacted our lives and this world for His glory. Following are the reports on our Student Ministries (partial), Adult Ministries, Leadership Development, and Relationally-based Discipleship.

## **Student Ministries**

With each passing year, while my involvement in our youth ministry lessens, my passion for seeing our young people mature in Christ does not. I am so thankful for how God led our church to invite Pastor Kevin Schular to be our new Associate Pastor of Student Ministries. It's been a joy to see him transition into his role, and our staff, so well. I look forward to seeing what lies in store for our students in the years ahead under Pastor Kevin and his team's leadership.

As Kevin will be writing a report on Student Ministries, I just want to take time to thank all of our church family who have served God so faithfully by investing in our youth and young adults over the past years without fulltime pastoral support. *Krista Wynne* and her team have done a fantastic job of ministering to our middle school students. It's a blessing to see how that ministry has flourished since its inception just a few years ago. *Emily Walker* has faithfully planned social events where our young adults have been able to build relationships (BBQ's, Breakfasts, Game Nights) and serve our community (neighborhood clean up in the spring) together. Also, on three occasions, kind-hearted LifeGroups have initiated Sunday Lunches where our Young Adults have been able to enjoy a wonderful meal while developing relationships around the table.

I enjoyed my time with our Gr. 8-10 students this past year during our Monday Discipleship Nights that happened twice a month. From Jan to Feb, Krista and I worked through a book called *Do Hard Things* with our students. Then, in the spring, John Bergmann and I led our youth through a five session series called *Find Your Fit - Dare to Act on Who You Are*. While my official time of leading our youth is over, I look forward to continually developing relationships with our youth and young adults in the years ahead.

## **Adult Ministries (Men/Women/Seniors)**

In 2015, for our winter breakfast, Men's Ministry invited police chaplain *George Labossiere* to come and share insights with us regarding the *Family Life of Police Officers* so that we would be better equipped to pray for our police force during our week of the *365 Police Prayer Watch* at the end of January. In the spring, we decided to do something different and made arrangements with Camp Nutimik to have our first *Men's Work Retreat* from May 8<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup>. It was great to serve the camp together, and we hope that this experience is leading us towards a full weekend retreat in the not too distant future. In the fall we decided to focus on prayer again and tied the theme of our morning event to the content of the women's retreat. We asked a number of women which sessions on prayer impacted them the most at their fall retreat, and we ended up focusing our time on the *Locks and Keys* of prayer. Many

thanks to Wayne Litke, Sig Muth, Andy Oeste, Darryl Penner, Scott Tully, and Steve Morris who, along with me, make up the leadership team.

Each year I am encouraged to see the ministry that occurs amongst the women of our church family. *Kelly Karam* serves as my primary connecting point with the various aspects of our women's ministry. I am extremely grateful for the many women who have invested themselves into the spiritual and relational well-being of the women in our church (Carol Bergmann, Lorraine Bergmann, Dale Fast, Shirley Gagnon, Sheryl Hague, Debbie Hopkins, Pat Janke, Sonya Sawatsky, Dolores Tully, Karen Schroeder and Phyllis Van Drunen to name a few). During the winter and spring months, a Bible Study entitled: *Children of the Day: A Study of 1 & 2 Thessalonians* by Beth Moore was offered at two different times (daytime in the winter and evenings in spring). The ladies tea on April 18<sup>th</sup> was a special event where 70+ women enjoyed an inspirational speaker, great fellowship and special music. *Secret Sisters* continued to provide wonderful fellowship and prayer support for many women who were each provided one "secret sister" to pray for and encourage throughout the year, and in turn received the same. Finally, in the fall, the women had their 5<sup>th</sup> annual retreat with the theme of *Prayer*. Beyond watching a number of impacting video sessions on prayer, the women were encouraged by testimonies from women in our church (Lorraine deMonye and Zarifa Salzgeber). Praise God for all the good things the women of WRBC have experienced together in 2015!

*Growing in Grace* is our 55+ ministry that takes place over the lunch hour on the second Thursday of each month. Bonnie Tholl and her team (Shannon Swartz, Audrey Hughes, John & Helen Goertzen, Bob Van Drunen, Lorna Betcher, Nick & Mavis Fedorchuk, Anne Pohl) always create a wonderful atmosphere and delicious meals for those attending. Beyond the monthly lunches, *Growing in Grace* also enjoyed a trip to the Iberville Hutterite Colony this fall. Over the winter and spring months, a monthly bible study was hosted by our pastors that focused on fostering discussions about the sermon series on the *Life of David*. In the fall, plans were made to start up a new 50+ bible study in 2016 that would occur twice a month and have both a 10 am and 7 pm option in hopes of broadening the impact of ministry with the older population within our church family. Our first offering will be a video series by David Jeremiah called *Agents of the Apocalypse*, and we are very encouraged by the amount of interest shown already and look forward to seeing how God may use these opportunities to foster Christ-honoring relationships within our church family.

### **Leadership Development**

Over the past number of years, Bob Fast and Dave Barton have invested themselves in providing leadership training opportunities for our church family (and beyond). From January to May, the focus was on leading

people through the six sessions of the participant's guide of *Experiencing Leadership – Letting Go of Leadership Heresies* by Don Cousins. From May 4<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup>, we were blessed to have Don Cousins come to our church. During this time, Don met with our board and staff on the 4<sup>th</sup>, our leadership group and NAB Pastors during the morning of the 5<sup>th</sup>, and then he provided an Equipping Seminar for our church family that evening. On May 6<sup>th</sup>, Don met with us as pastoral staff which benefited us greatly in thinking through next steps for equipping our church family to live as God has intended us to. I believe we will see the fruit of the efforts mentioned above in the years ahead.

### **Relationally-Based Discipleship**

As a church, our goal is to *Nurture Followers of Jesus Christ Through Healthy Relationships* which is the focus of every ministry of our church. Following are a few ways we moved towards our goal in offering opportunities for cross-generational activities.

#### *Family Meals and Equipping Seminars*

One of the ways we planned to foster friendships within our church was through the family meals and equipping seminars. Under the guidance of our church staff, the following dates, themes and speakers were chosen:

- Feb 1<sup>st</sup> – *Where is the Lord leading our Church in 2015?*
- Mar 1<sup>st</sup> – *Irene Toews – Lessons in War and Peace – The Story of My Life*
- Nov 1<sup>st</sup> – *Prayer for Refugees (facilitated by Chris Schroeder)*

We hope that each evening provided a wonderful opportunity for people to connect with one another in a meaningful and Christ-honoring way. It was no surprise that for each meal George Giesbrecht and his team did an exceptional job in preparing a meal for us to enjoy together.

#### *LifePath Seminars*

At the heart of our relationship with God is an ever deepening appreciation for who He is and who we are because of Him. In April, a three session course entitled *Understanding Your Story with Christ* was held in order to help people recognize and praise God for all the ways He has shown Himself loving and faithful towards them. It is our hope that, as we are able to better put into words how the gospel of Jesus Christ has impacted our lives we will grow in our trust and love of Him and also our desire to share Christ with others.

#### *Studies and Adult Electives*

In order for us to mature in Christ, it is essential for us to encounter Him through the study of Scripture with people of like desire. This past year we had two homes that intentionally provided such opportunities during the winter months by studying the Gospel of Mark (*Christianity*

*Explored* – hosted by Rene and Shirley Gagnon) and the book of Philippians (*Discipleship Explored* – hosted by Emmie and Bogdan Dryjski, Michelle Schmidt, and myself). In the fall, we continued to meet at the home of the Dryski's and used the Visual Bible to watch and discuss the Gospel of Matthew together.

On Sunday mornings, we held our adult elective in the lower auditorium during the 9 am service. In the winter, we watched an eight part video series by John Piper called *God is the Gospel* (discussions led by Steve Morris). Then, in the spring, Chris Wettstein led us through four sessions that he prepared for us on *The Apostles Creed*. During the fall, Steve Morris facilitated discussion of the classic book written by Dietrich Bonhoeffer called *Life Together* that focused on the exploration of faith in community. I am very thankful for the leadership that Steve and Chris provided for these electives and was personally blessed in participating with the groups they led.

#### *Scripture Studies*

Of utmost importance to our church family is having an intimate relationship with God through Jesus Christ. In order to enhance our regular practice of expository preaching through books of the Bible, we have created scripture studies that focus on the passage that each message is based on. This year, Scripture Studies were created for *1 & 2 Samuel* and *James*. We hope that these studies will be used as a basis for conversation with others, especially within the setting of LifeGroups.

#### *LifeGroups*

As I look at 2015, the thing that encourages me most about our LifeGroups is that a core of leadership is forming to focus on this important ministry for our church family. The team currently consists of Bob Fast, Lorraine DeMonyé, Cameron Buchanan and myself, and we are looking forward to enlarging our team by one or two more individuals in the New Year. We started meeting in November, and our primary focus has been on a six session equipping series based on *Experiencing Leadershift* by Don Cousins that will be offered during the winter months of 2016. Once that is completed, our aim will be to prepare for a renewed start of LifeGroups in the fall. Our hope is to see this ministry flourish as we find ways to promote the value of LifeGroups and provide specific times of focus where people will be encouraged to join LifeGroups that are waiting to welcome them in. I am grateful for the LifeGroups we have in WRBC and for the facilitators who have served their groups so faithfully throughout 2015.

This has been a significant year for me in variety of ways filled with many memories, and in particular: being part of the *Pathway* mission team, led by John and Wendy Bergmann, to Garden Hill; being part of the *GriefShare* team (Andrew Friesen & Irene Toews) led by Lorraine

deMonye; attending our NAB Triennial in Sacramento in July; and preaching a number of sermons in our *Life of David* and *James* series.

Years from now, I will still remember that it was in 2015 that I graduated with my Doctor of Ministry Degree in *Community Spiritual Formation* from Denver Seminary (Oral Defense on Feb 25<sup>th</sup> and Graduation on May 16<sup>th</sup>). While I am grateful to have completed my studies, I am more thankful for how God has used this process to increase my love and trust of Him. Thank you for journeying with me through this process. I covet your prayers as I seek God for ways to bless others, within and without of our church family, with the experiences, education, passions and gifts He has entrusted me with.

But 2015 will also be remembered for the intense journey that God has brought us through as a church family and how He used some of life's hardest experiences to draw us closer to Him and each other. I truly felt like I have been riding on the coattails of God this year and could share with you numerous stories of how God has help me to grow in dependence of His Holy Spirit in my daily living. My appreciation for the body of Christ has grown in 2015 as I have witnessed the beauty of seeing Christ use us to care for one another – and I thank you for caring for me as I care for you.

Having just concluded another Christmas season, we are entering into a new year freshly reminded of the wonderful grace that has been given to us through Jesus Christ, who set aside all glory to sacrifice Himself for us so that might know forgiveness for sin and renewed relationship with our loving God. And as I sit to write my annual report for 2015, a year of both joyful experiences and painfully devastating losses in our church family, I am reminded that through it all our God has remained constant, continually walking with us as our Lord Immanuel.

The following is a report from areas of WRBC ministry in which I am involved.

**Worship Ministry**

*“And He died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for Him who died for them and was raised again.” – 2 Corinthians 5:15*

Truly the point of all of creation is the worship and pleasure of the glorious God who has saved us. The growth of His Kingdom is ultimately about the increase of honour that is given to Him. As more hearts surrender themselves to the saving grace of Christ, His Kingdom is furthered. As these surrendered hearts grow in their desire to honour and glorify Christ, His Kingdom is furthered. Our most profound joy is meant to be found in the honouring of Christ as we bring to Him our love, our trust, our hurts, our hopes, our actions, our thoughts, our purpose, our brokenness, our adoration. I believe this to be at the heart of what worship is.

As we recognize the broad scope of what worship is, it becomes clear that our worship of God is meant to be all-encompassing, stretching far beyond Sunday morning services. However, Sunday morning services remain an important part of church life, as it is here that we most consistently gather for the great privilege of worshipping our God as a church family.

A part of my role at this church is to oversee these and other times of corporate worship. I am grateful for the many individuals who serve together with me in facilitating corporate worship – other pastoral staff, the worship team members and those who have share faith stories or special songs. I am also very glad for all of those who serve a little more behind the scenes yet who are so incredibly important in the facilitation of worship gatherings: the people in the sound room (coordinated by Terrance Wynne), the ushers (coordinated by Bob Hogue), the coffee bar (coordinated by Sheryl Hague), the Information Centre (coordinated by Kathy Kornelsen) and those involved in creating banners/bulletin graphics (Mark Henkelman, Girish Manuel).

Special gatherings of worship in 2015 included a Hymn Night in March, a Good Friday service (“A Tale of Two Sinners” – a dramatic service that emphasized that to be “forgiven much” requires one to recognize the need for forgiveness and to repent of sin), Easter, and Camp Nutimik Sunday. Our Advent theme related to the many faces of poverty (spiritual, relational, emotional and material) and how we are called as Christians to respond. Our Christmas Eve service was entitled “Immanuel: Saviour to a Broken World” where we considered together how Christ came to save us from our spiritual brokenness, be with us in our experiential brokenness and send us into the world’s brokenness.

This year we held Worship by the Lake (our annual weekend at the McGillivray property) on September 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>. On the Saturday evening, we celebrated God’s leading in the church’s summer ministry initiatives (Camp Nutimik, Adventure@theRidge, Bolivia and Garden Hill). On the Sunday morning, we had our outdoor worship service together with Winnipeg Somang Presbyterian Church.

I enjoyed leading worship at Living Bible Explorers (a ministry to core-area kids) on two occasions in 2015. Special thanks to Girish Manuel and Matt Litke for being a part of that, and to Mark Henkelman for giving us the opportunity to serve there.

### **Congregational Care**

*“Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn.” – Romans 12:15*

In 2015, my overseeing of congregational care at WRBC largely fell into two categories.

*Counselling/Visitation* – One of my passions is to talk deeply with people about things that genuinely matter. To me, a conversation with individuals, couples or families who are in the midst of relational struggle, physical brokenness or spiritual wrestling is like standing with them on sacred ground. Part of my role at WRBC is to come alongside others in pastoral counselling or hospital visits and I consider it a privilege to minister to my church family in this way.

*Deacons Ministry* – Just over a month ago we introduced the Deacons team to the church family on a Sunday morning. This team works prayerfully and intentionally behind the scenes in order to care for our church family. The following things are very important to us on the Deacons team:

- Walking alongside those who are pursuing baptism and membership in our church
- Providing care, help and comfort to those facing crises of loss, health, finances, and relationships
- Connecting with newcomers and helping those newcomers to connect with others
- Helping individuals and families in integrating into our church family
- Overseeing the visitation of those in our church who are physically less mobile and therefore not as able to connect with others
- Praying for our church family in general as well as specifically when we are aware of individual situations
- Overseeing the process of facilitating communion and baptism in our church

I am blessed to work with a wonderful team of Deacons who deeply love the Lord and who genuinely care for the well-being of those in our church family. The team consists of: Anthony Dyck (Deacons chair and Board representative), Denise Naim, Denis Carmichael, Pratima Manuel, Raj Manuel, Michelle Schmidt, Dale Fast and Irene Toews. Please feel free to approach any one of us in regards to baptism, membership or any care needs.

## **Communication Ministry**

On November 6<sup>th</sup>, Dave Henkelman passed away and we lost a dearly loved leader, brother and friend. Dave had previously served as the pastor of Whyte Ridge Baptist and also in numerous pastoral positions within the Manitoba Baptist Association. For most of the last several years, Dave was highly involved in communication ministry at WRBC. He designed and maintained our website, established uniformity of email addresses for church staff, created our announcement slides for Sunday morning and was also involved in email mail-outs and Facebook postings, communicating ministry information from the leadership to the church family. Dave's work and creativity was integral in bringing about a new level of communication within this church and the benefit to ministry was immeasurable.

This past fall, when Dave was already not feeling well enough to work, a small group of us got together to talk about how to continue the numerous areas of communication that Dave had been so greatly involved in building and maintaining. This group consisted of Chris Schroeder (the head of the communication team in our church), Wayne Edel, Azhar Laldin, Terrance Wynne and Rafa Lastiri Monroy. I very much appreciated the dedication that these guys brought to the discussion and to the distribution of duties that came out of that meeting.

In more recent days, Chris Schroeder has stepped up to give permanent oversight to the role created for Dave Henkelman in the newly defined role of *WRBC Communications Coordinator*. This role includes maintenance, content creation and further development of our online presence ([www.whyteridgebaptist.ca](http://www.whyteridgebaptist.ca)) and social media platforms, overseeing Sunday morning announcements slides and content, further development of our online directory and communications, ministry and pastoral / leadership communications support, and seeking out and implementing innovations to continually improve the communications process at WRBC. Chris' willingness to use his gifts in this area is much appreciated, and he is looking forward to continuing to work together with those within our congregations with gifts and passion to serve via communications, social media, photography and visual production.

## **Sabbatical**

This past summer, I was generously granted a three-month sabbatical leave. My family and I are extremely grateful to the church for this, as well as to the people who anonymously donated the funds necessary to allow Lynelle to be off work as well so that we and our kids could travel together to Bolivia for the months of July and August.

Our time in Bolivia was a wonderful mix of rest and ministry. We had our own apartment and had a lot of time to build life and routine, making new friends and finding regular places to shop and eat in our neighbourhood. We also served at Casa de la Amistad, a ministry to children who have parents who are in prison. Many of the children live in the prison with their parents as well. During our time serving at the Casa, Lynelle, Josh, Beth and I were involved in helping the children at the Casa to learn songs in Spanish in preparation for a short concert we did with them at a church at the end of the summer. This concert was planned in order to help raise awareness of the Casa de la Amistad ministry within the local church. We enjoyed our music practices with the various age-groups of children (ranging from pre-school to 17 years of age), but our favourite experiences were mostly in the unstructured times of breakfast and lunch together, when we were able to spend time talking, playing, crocheting (Lynelle and Beth) and drawing (Josh and I) with the children. We came to love these children very much and we still think of them often.

In the middle of our time in Bolivia, the Bolivia Mission team from Whyte Ridge came to serve for two weeks. It was great to see some familiar faces and we very much enjoyed serving together with the team for the time that they were there, painting at the Baptist Seminary in Cochabamba and plastering houses near the small town of Misque. Lynelle and I are both especially grateful for the way in which the team embraced and showed love to our kids. What a wonderful cross-generational church experience for Josh and Beth!

All and all, our sabbatical experience was amazing. We are glad to be able to have had so much time together as a family, and the experiences and relationships that the Lord granted us have changed us and continue to affect us. Thank you again to our church family for all that you did in allowing this to take place.

During my sabbatical, there were a number of people who stepped up to provide extra help in my absence. Melanie Friesen, Karen Schroeder, Janna Banman and Dustin Martin each gave a lot of their time to worship team leadership while I was away. Tom and Victoria Griffioen volunteered their time in overseeing sanctuary cleanup after our worship services. Also, there were a number of people on both Staff and the Deacons who shifted their involvements in congregational care during those months. Thanks everyone, for all of the extra time you gave.

### **Personal Highlights**

Other personal highlights for me during this past year included preaching in May (1 Samuel 28), officiating at the wedding of Ron Hall and Martha Giesbrecht in October, and very recently officiating at the

funeral of my dad's uncle, a man whose faith and life I have come to very much respect. I find that every time that I am required to write a sermon, the preparation time in God's Word is especially enriching to me.

Another highlight of this past year was the planning of the Love & Respect Marriage Seminar this past March. It was a very helpful curriculum for many. I am grateful for all of the work that Steve and Barb Morris and Tim and Sheryl Hague put into the process of planning and implementing this program.

Whyte Ridge Baptist Church has been family to me for more than twenty years now, and I thank God that He has allowed me to serve Him within this church family. In 2016 and the years to come, may He be glorified through the work that He does in and around us as we seek Him and serve Him together.

In 2015, I found myself so thankful for an amazing team of youth leaders. We are seeing a team that is committed to the Lord, our kids and their relationship with Christ. The Wave leadership team continues to bring great ideas, and they have the willingness to see them through. One of the greatest encouragements for me has been when asking when our leaders are available and seeing their commitment to each time the youth gather. It has also been very encouraging to sit in team meetings with this group and hear their creativity and their commitment to making sure that our kids are learning more about the Lord when we gather.

Our numbers at the Wave have remained at a steady 30 for the last year. Though we do not focus on the numbers, what we are seeing is a group of very committed kids to the Wave. This is exciting because we can see their growth relationally and spiritually. By the time the kids are in their last year of the Wave, they are hungry for more study time with the Lord and relationships with their fellow peers are healthy and growing.

In our devotional time at the Wave, we have tried several different approaches. We have taken topics or themes, books of the Bible, and followed the sermon series. ## Children's Ministries

### Grace Elke

Children's Ministry provides programming for children from infancy through to grade 4 through the *Little Lambs Nursery* and *SONSeekers*. We, also, provide for a safe and secure environment for our children/youth and volunteers through our *Plan to Protect* program.

Our theme for the 2014/2015 ministry year for grades 1 to 4 was *The Year of Faith*. Through learning each week about the faith of Paul or Peter or the lame man or Joshua or Daniel, our children and volunteers alike were challenged to deepen their own faith. We were also reminded through the lives of these Bible heroes that we have a God who can never fail.

God's faithfulness to us has been shown throughout the past year and some of the highlights include:

- A full complement of volunteers who faithfully cared for our nursery kids, greeted and provided security, listened to verse memorized, and taught and shepherd our kids week after week – just over 60 in total!
- Several youth helpers assisting and being mentored in our nursery and preschool classrooms.
- Large group worship times where we learn what it means to worship God each day and where we see our kids and volunteers actively engaged in worship through song, reciting Scripture, audibly praying praise to God, etc.
- Seeing 14 kids complete an entire year of Bible memorization
- Bringing our offerings to God so that we can help kids in Winnipeg receive healthy meals through *Agape Table for Kids*.
- Making and donating cookies and juice boxes for the after school programs at *Living Bible Explorers*.
- Corresponding with and praying for our church supported missionaries – Lyndell and Paulo in Brazil, Elsie in Cameroon, Katy and Mark in Winnipeg.
- Experiencing a great week of adventure @ the ridge day camps at Lindenwoods Community Centre that saw a total of 37 kids registered.
- Having an awesome summer worker in the person of Sonia Wilson who planned and implemented the program for our summer day camps and the Sunday morning program for preschoolers in July and August.
- The 4 paid crew leaders and the 12 volunteers who did a great job working alongside Sonia in giving consistency to the day camp program and providing for times of relationship building with the kids.
- Having a good number of our kids together with their families serve at Meadowood Manor for LOVE WINNIPEG.
- Discipling our kids to develop meaningful relationships with people from other cultures as we made pictures for the Bolivia team to share with the children they ministered to and making salvation bracelets for the *Pathways* team to take to Garden Hill.

- Encouraging meaningful family meal times through our combined *faith @ home* and Christmas church banquet event under the direction of Tanya Humphries and with comedian Timmy Boyle as our guest.
- Celebrating Christmas together with our church family through our program *Follow the Star* under the direction of Janine Carmichael and Sharon Mohr.

***“To come alongside families in creating a Christ centered environment for their children so that in God’s timing, each child will enter into a relationship with Jesus Christ”*** is our mission/purpose statement for Children’s Ministry. This is a solemn and daunting task. I am so grateful to be helped and encouraged in this task by our Children’s Ministry Leadership Team and the many who volunteer each Sunday.

Our Children’s Ministry Leadership Team meets regularly to set vision and program for our ministry and consists of Janine Carmichael, Michelle Schmidt, Sheilla Taylor, Dolores Tully and Sandee Wiltshire.

Looking ahead to the present ministry year, we continue with goals that enable our kids to develop an intimate relationship with God, to build authentic relationships within their own families and the church family at large, and to foster caring relationships to those in our neighbourhoods and with people of different cultures.

Prayer has always been an integral part of our SONSeeker program, but it is an area that we commit to further develop and strengthen within our kids and volunteers through specific goals which we have set in this regard.

I believe that 2015 has been a year of financial challenge for WRBC, but it has also been a year of blessing. We entered the year knowing that we had made a commitment to add a new full-time staff member, and have been blessed by the Lord bringing Pastor Kevin Schular and his family to join us. We knew that we would have additional expenses for the upkeep of our current building, but these costs went beyond expectations as multiple furnaces and air conditioners required repair or

replacement. While we struggled for much of the year to maintain a positive balance in our General Fund, we successfully funded our Missions Trips to an unprecedented level and continued to meet needs through consistent giving to our Benevolent Fund. Giving to our Capital Fund remained strong, enabling this fund balance to increase even though we had begun to incur expenses (such as the Feasibility Study) in anticipation of building a new facility.

I have seen time and again how the Spirit has moved the membership at WRBC to rise to a challenge and meet a financial need. This past year, there have been many needs within, and close to, our congregation that have been met through the initiative, and response, of our membership. These experiences helped reinforce my belief that the Lord would provide what was required in order to meet our financial commitments by year end. As you can see in the financial statements on the following pages, the negative income in our General and Missions Trip Funds was offset by positive income in our Capital and Benevolent Funds, resulting in a net balanced budget. All praise and glory to God for this result!

The Finance Team for 2015 included Gerald Kornelsen (Financial Administrator), Susan Bergmann (Financial Secretary), Franco Aiello, Bruce Brown, Rene Gagnon, Norm Piel and Dave Wynne (ex-officio as Chair of BoCG). I thank you all for the wisdom and insight that each of you bring to our Team. Susan has now handed over to Shirley Wynne, who will carry on as our new Financial Secretary, effective January 1, 2016. Susan: Words cannot express our gratitude for the excellent job that you have done as a faithful servant in this role for many years. Shirley: Welcome to the Finance Team, we are extremely pleased that you have chosen to join us.

This past year I have served as an ex-officio member of the Capital Funds Team, which is chaired by John Wiltshire. This will be a big year for John and his team as we prepare for a Capital Funds Campaign in the fall. I look forward to our Teams working together as we discern what God has in store for us, and how he will use us to help meet the financial needs of both our operating budget and the building project. I know that we will continue to experience challenges, however I am also confident that God will bless us as we rise to these challenges, in His power and for His glory.




