The God of our fathers has chosen you to know His will and to see the Righteous One and to hear words from His mouth. You will be his witness to all men of what you have seen and heard.

- Acts 22:14

The secular testimony is focused on the self --- how it arrived despite the obstacles on the road. The Christian testimony is focused on the Person, that Great Obstacle in our wandering path --- that Brilliant Light who kicked us off our horse and blinded us, and calls us to repent and be baptized, and commissions us on His great work, and even tells us we will suffer for His sake. This is Christian testimony.

<u>The Five Solas:</u> Celebrating 500 years since the Protestant Reformation.

- Sola Fide We are saved through faith alone in Jesus Christ, not by our good works.
- Sola Scriptura We follow as our highest authority the Bible alone, not Church Tradition.
- Solus Christus We are redeemed by the mediation of Jesus Christ alone, no one else.
- Sola Gratia We are saved by the grace of God alone, not by our human merit.
- Soli Deo Gloria We live for the glory of God alone. He is supreme in all things.

The Message of God's Grace in Christ:

- 1. The Message can be Mixed --- Is the Gospel enough? (21:20 26)
- 2. The Message can be Muddled --- Is the Gospel against us? (21:27 29; 24:5 16)
- 3. The Message can be Muted --- Is the Gospel being heard? (22:22 25)
- 4. The Message can be Magnified --- Is the Gospel our Testimony? (22:14 16)

- o How could the 'Five Solas' be used as a personal and devotional exercise in your life?
- o How do we mix the message today and communicate that the gospel is not enough?
- o How is the gospel 'against us' (21:28) and how is it for us?
- What keeps people from hearing the gospel and / or our testimony today?
- o What are the key ingredients of a good testimony?
