## English Standard Version Bible - Study Bible<sup>1</sup>

Romans 11:33-36

**<u>11:33-36</u>** Concluding Doxology. As he concludes his setting forth of God's great plan in the history of salvation (chs. 1-11), Paul breaks forth into praise. God's wisdom and ways are far beyond the understanding of human beings, and hence he deserves all the glory.

<u>11:34-35</u> The words of <u>Isa. 40:13</u> teach that no human being knows **the mind of the Lord** apart from revelation, and no one can serve as God's adviser. Likewise the majestic words of <u>Job 41:11</u> are a reminder that no one ultimately gives anything to God. Instead, everything humans have is a gift from God (<u>1 Cor. 4:7</u>).

**<u>11:36</u>** Since **all things** are from God, and through God, and for God, it follows that he deserves all the **glory forever**. God's saving plan brings him great honor, praise, and glory forever and ever.

## Holman Christian Standard Bible - Study Bible<sup>2</sup> Romans 11:33-36

**<u>11:33-36</u>** In these verses Paul concludes his line of reasoning that Israel's current unbelief is no argument against the truth of the gospel. He is moved to exclamations of wonder at God's wisdom, power, and plan. Who could have foreseen what God was working out? Paul cites various OT texts to express God's incomprehensible purposes. God is to be honored because He is the Alpha and the Omega—the Creator, the sustainer and ruler, and the goal of all things (cp. Cranfield, *Romans*, 2:591).

## **NLT Life Application Study Bible<sup>3</sup>**

Romans 11:33-36

**<u>11:34-36</u>** The implication of these questions is that no one has fully understood the mind of the Lord. No one has been his counselor. And God owes nothing to any one of us. Isaiah and Jeremiah asked similar questions to show that we are unable to give advice to God or criticize his ways (<u>Isaiah 40:13</u>; <u>Jeremiah 23:18</u>). God alone is the possessor of absolute power and absolute wisdom. In the final analysis, all of us are absolutely dependent on God. He is the source of all things, including ourselves. He is the power that sustains and rules the world that we live in. And God works out all things to bring glory to himself. The all-powerful God deserves our praise.

# Life Application Concise New Testament Commentary<sup>4</sup>

Romans 11:33-36

<u>11:33-35</u> Here Paul bursts into a song of praise as he concludes his entire treatise in <u>chapters 1–11</u> on God's sovereign plan for our salvation. It is **impossible for us to understand.** Paul quoted from <u>Isaiah 40:13</u>, pointing out that God alone knows the plan. In his unsearchable wisdom he designed it. No human being was, is, or will ever be involved in giving him advice or making new suggestions. Then Paul quotes loosely from <u>Job 41:11</u> to point out that God is in sovereign control. He is not in our debt, we are in his!

<u>11:36</u> God is the Creator, Sustainer, and Omega of all life. Everything **comes from him** and is for him to use for **his glory.** God is almighty and all-powerful, but even more, he cares for us personally. No person or power can compare with God.

Paul began his letter with the statement that God left his imprint on the world he created, but that the human beings of that creation had chosen rebellion. In the past eleven chapters, Paul has examined God's marvelous plan for bringing the rebels home. God has chosen to "have mercy on everyone" (<u>11:32</u>). What more can any believer, saved by grace, say than, **to him be glory evermore. Amen.**
