

When God Opens a Door Introduction to Philippians (Acts 16)

What He opens no one can shut, and what He shuts no one can open. (Revelation 3:7)

Introduction:

Paul's mission trip to Philippi took place in AD 51, ten years before the writing of the letter to the Philippians. The trip was the direct result of God opening doors of ministry and resulted in the first

	church planted in Europe. Today we will study how Paul and his companions discerned the oper door and experienced the blessing of God.
