Introduction:

Last week we read about the divided kingdom that David inherited. Today we see the means God used to unite that kingdom and end the civil war in Israel. We will also see the responsibility God's people have in recognizing His Spirit's anointing, following where God leads and giving God glory.

Sermon Outline:

1. God builds His Kingdom through His Anointed means and according to His Promises

(1 Sam. 16:13; 2 Sam. 3:1, 9, 18; 4:9; 5:1 - 2, 12)

2. God's People acknowledge His Spirit's Anointing and Believe in His Promises

(2 Samuel 3:9 - 10, 36 - 37; 5:1 - 5)

3. God's Anointed Leaders Trust in the Lord to Lead, and give Him the Glory

(2 Samuel 2:1; 4:9; 5:1 - 2, 9 - 12, 19, 23)

Questions for Reflection / Discussion:

- Why did it take Israel so long to acknowledge God's anointed King and believe His promise concerning David? What does Israel teach us about the Lordship of Christ in our lives?
