Leaders/Members of WRBC Mission Projects are reminded that they are ambassadors of the Lord Jesus Christ. As you serve you not only represent God, but also your country and church. This is a tremendous responsibility. Consequently, you should strive to be above reproach in your actions and attitudes.

You agree to:

- * Submit to your Team Leader's authority
- * Attend the training sessions laid out by your Team Leader for your particular mission
- * Conduct yourself according to the policies and guidelines below that have been adopted from our NAB conference (Gateway Teams).

If at any time during this Missions Project behavior constitutes a problem, the Team Leader has the authority to send you home.

Additional costs incurred as a result of this action will be at your expense.

Conduct:

Because of the wide range of cultures and customs WRBC Missions Projects works in, it is necessary to have some standard guidelines that allow all teams to participate with safety, a clear conscience, and without the potential for hindering the work of a missionary or pastor in any culture. These policies are for all team members during ministry with WRBC Mission Projects regardless of age:

- * No narcotics, underage drinking of alcoholic beverages, or tobacco in any form. (Moderate alcohol use is common in the daily life of many cultures).
- * Personal entertainment and communication devices (i-pods, mp-3s, cell phones) are recommended only during travel.
- * No culturally inappropriate dancing, music or clothing.
- * No exclusive male/female relationships with a national, or within the team (except, of course, for married couples). - * Conduct yourself according to the policies and guidelines below that have been adopted from our NAB conference (Gateway Teams).

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Conduct:

Any undisciplined relationships that jeopardize team unity, effectiveness of the team's ministry, or the ministry of our host receivers will NOT be tolerated and could result in dismissal of a team member.

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Conflict resolution within the team

We expect that God is going to do some marvelous things through us, as well as within us. It is important that you understand that this experience is not for everyone. The team training for this trip will require a high level of commitment The mission to Northeast India will be an intensive 17 day period focused on serving and ministering to people from a very different culture. At this point in time we are developing our team and plan for it to consist of 5-6 members – including Pastor Doug who will be leading the team.

As a potential team member there are specific qualifications that you need to possess in order to join this missions endeavor. Leaders/Members of WRBC Mission Projects are reminded that they are ambassadors of the Lord Jesus Christ. As you serve you not only represent God, but also your country and church. This is a tremendous responsibility. Consequently, you should strive to be above reproach in your actions and attitudes.

You agree to:

- * Submit to your Team Leader's authority
- * Attend the training sessions laid out by your Team Leader for your particular mission
- * Conduct yourself according to the policies and guidelines below that have been adopted from our NAB conference (Gateway Teams).

If at any time during this Missions Project behavior constitutes a problem, the Team Leader has the authority to send you home.

Additional costs incurred as a result of this action will be at your expense.

Conduct:

Because of the wide range of cultures and customs WRBC Missions Projects works in, it is necessary to have some standard guidelines that allow all teams to participate with safety, a clear conscience, and without the potential for hindering the work of a missionary or pastor in any culture. These policies are for all team members during ministry with WRBC Mission Projects regardless of age:

- * No narcotics, underage drinking of alcoholic beverages, or tobacco in any form. (Moderate alcohol use is common in the daily life of many cultures).
- * Personal entertainment and communication devices (i-pods, mp-3s, cell phones) are recommended only during travel.
- * No culturally inappropriate dancing, music or clothing.
- * No exclusive male/female relationships with a national, or within the team (except, of course, for married couples). Many North American customs of dating including embracing, holding hands, etc. are not shared by many of the cultures that WRBC Missions Projects serve. Spending too much time with another team member or national can be misread. Any undisciplined relationships that jeopardize team unity, effectiveness of the team's ministry, or the ministry of our host receivers will NOT be tolerated and could result in dismissal of a team member.

Unity, Cooperation & Conflict Resolution:

Conflict resolution within the team

To put aside personal desires and differences for the sake of unity and cooperation should be handled privately with those involved according to Matthew 18:15. If still unresolved, the Team Leader should be consulted in a private context away from the public work of the team.

Conflict resolution with someone outside of the team - should be taken to the Team Leader(s) who will consult with the host receiver.

The final authority in conflict resolution rests with the Team Leader.

Additional Guidelines:

1. Security & Protection

Listen carefully to and obey all the guidelines that the Team Leaders and especially the host national/pastor/missionary gives regarding safety in your mission location. Review the dangers and risks associated with serving in your mission location. Seriously consider the Release of Liability that you are signing to work with the WRBC Mission Project and the stipulations it contains.

2. Gifts

Some general principles for giving gifts to national Christians:

- * Never give monetary gifts individual to individual.
- * Monetary gifts should only be given to a ministry/church from the team as a whole. (The only exception would be giving to the church's offering.)
- * Give all gifts towards the end of your mission so as not to make the receiver feel obligated to give in return.

3. Finances & Shopping

Honor the Lord with your personal finances by not showing off purchases and exploiting our North American wealth. Use discretion when shopping – be careful to not carry around too much money or allow others to see you handling it.

4. Dress

Most of the guidelines in this area should come from your host national/pastor/ missionary. However, in many cases it will be best if you are conservative with your dress.

5. Political Conversations

Avoid talking about Canadian or national politics in the presence of non-team members. Remember, most people in the world consider all North Americas to be "United States" citizens and will often assume this.
