

## The Coming of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:1-21)

Study Notes Handout: Week Four

Like our Lord's death at Calvary, Pentecost was a once-for-all event that will not be repeated... we would not ask for another Pentecost any more than we would ask for another Calvary.

1. Pentecost and Old Testament Roots (Genesis 11; Leviticus 23; Joel 2)

The day of Pentecost was the point of transition between the Old Covenant work and ministry of the Holy Spirit and the New Covenant work and ministry of the Holy Spirit. - Wayne Grudem

2. Pentecost and the Baptism of the Spirit (Mt.3:11;Mk.1:8;Lk.3:16;Jn.1:33;Acts1:5;11:16;1Cor.12:13)

The baptism of the Spirit means that I belong to His body; the fullness of the Spirit means that my body belongs to Him. - Warren Wiersbe

3. Pentecost and the Great Commission (Mt. 28:18-20; Mk.16:15; Lk.24:49; Acts 1:8; 2:1 - 13)

The Spirit of Christ is the spirit of missions, and the nearer we get to Him, the more intensely missionary we must become. - Henry Martyn

4. Pentecost and the Last Days (2 Tim.3:1; Heb. 1:1-2; 1 Pet.1:20; 2 Pet.3:3; Acts 2:14 - 21)

Yes we are living in the last days, because the last days began with the first coming of Jesus, and will reach their climax at the second coming of Jesus. - John Piper

5. Pentecost and Us (Acts 2:4; 4:31; 9:17; 13:52; 1 Cor.6:19; Gal. 5:22-25; Eph. 4:30; 5:18; Heb.3:7)

There are no special Christians, only a special Christ. We have no need to ask Him to give us more. We need only ask Him to help us see all that He has already given. - R.C. Sproul Jr.
