Study Notes Handout: Week Five

Peter replied, 'Repent and be baptised, every one of you, in the Name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. This promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off - for all whom the Lord our God will call. (Acts 2:38-39)

- 2. When you hear about what the good news is NOT, how does it stack up with your ideas of the message of salvation? Which false version have you been tempted to believe or share in the past?
- 3. What are the key elements of the gospel that Peter preached and how might we describe them in the language of our day that is faithful to God's Word?
- 4. What can we learn from Peter about sharing our faith with others?
