Sermon Outline: Four Warnings and Three Blessings

Warnings:

- 1. Beware of Sinful Alliances (vs. 1 2)
- 2. Beware of Satanic Attack (vs. 3)
- 3. Beware of Self-Aggrandizement (vs. 4)
- 4. Beware of the Severity of God (vs. 5 11)

Blessings:

- 1. The Love of God for His People (vs. 1 11)
- 2. The Fear of God by His People (vs. 5, 11)
- 3. The Witness of God through His People (vs. 14 16)

Questions for Reflection / Discussion:

- i. How do you understand the severity of God's judgement in this N.T. story? Do you believe the events occurred? Do they offend you, or cause you fear? How do you 'justify God' in this action?
- ii. What does this passage teach about the Holy Spirit, the work of Satan, and the role of Church?
- iii. Do you get caught in self-aggrandizement? What kind of false version of you do you present to others? How do you answer the question in vs. 4 What makes you think of doing such things?
