Introduction: The Parable of the Mission Trip to Nepal

- o Trust my son even as you trust me. Follow him and he will guide you safely to our village.
- o Don't walk in the dark or at night. It is dangerous. Always walk in the light with one another.
- o Follow the map that I have sent, and obey everything in it so you don't get lost.
- o Stay on the path. Don't get distracted with the attractions that tempt you along the way.
- o Take care of each other. Some might find the trek harder than others, so work together.

Key Verse: 1 John 5:13

These things I have written unto you who believe in the Name of the Son of God, so that you
may know you have eternal life.

1. What has John written?

"These things I have written" - the various tests / signs / proofs of genuine faith.

2. Who has John written?

o "Unto you who believe in the Name of the Son of God" - those who are truly born of God.

3. Why has John written?

o <u>"So that you may know you have eternal life"</u> - to give assurance to God's children.

Practical Things to Discuss:

- o Did the parable of the Mission Trip to Nepal help clarify any spiritual truths for you?
- o Do you struggle with having assurance of your eternal salvation in Christ?
- o What signs / proofs of your eternal security in Christ do you have in your life?
- What do you think God the Father thinks about you? How does He look upon you?
- o How do you need to realign your thinking with God's Word as a result of this message?
