Questions for Reflection and Discussion

What are your thoughts on the story of the Tower of Babel? Do you think of the lessons as relevant to today?

In what ways were the builders of the Tower of Babel disobedient to God's commands? In other words, why was God so strong about preventing them from building the Tower?

Do you agree that there is a similar purpose between God's command to "fill the earth" and Jesus' command to "make disciples of all nations (peoples)"? How should we, as the Church, respond?

There are 6 ways that each of us can get involved in "filling the earth" with the knowledge of the glory of God:

- Going (which we think about first),
- Praying (which all of us can do),
- > Learning (which helps us to do all the others on this list),
- Sending (many ways in which we make it possible for others to go),
- > Welcoming (such as ECC) and
