

God's Righteous Judgement:

The Many Faces of False Security

Text: Romans 2:12 - 29

And the Lord your God will circumcise your heart and the heart of your offspring, so that you will love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul, that you may live. – Deuteronomy 30:6

For no one is a Jew who is merely one outwardly, nor is circumcision outward and physical. But a Jew is one inwardly, and circumcision is a matter of the heart, by the Spirit, not by the letter. His praise is not from man but from God. – Romans 2:28 – 29

The deceitfulness of the heart of man appears in no one thing so much as this - of spiritual pride and self-righteousness. The subtlety of Satan appears in his managing persons with respect to this sin. Perhaps one reason may be that here he has most experience; he knows the way of its coming in; he is acquainted with the secret springs of it; for it was his own sin. Experience gives vast advantage in leading souls, either in good or evil. – Jonathan Edwards
