
Peace with God...and much more?

- 1. Peace with God what is it, and what is it not?
 - Not
 - Is

- 2. Peace with God how was this made possible?
 - Justified by faith, vs 1
 - Justified by the blood of Jesus, v 9
 - Justified by the death of Jesus, vs 6,8,10
 - Christ died
 - Christ died at the right time
 - \circ Christ died for the ungodly, for sinners, for enemies of God

- 3. Peace with God and much more?
 - Grace in which we stand, vs 2
 - Rejoicing in hope of the glory of God, vs 2
 - Rejoicing in our sufferings, vss 3-5
 - Saved from the wrath of God, vs 9
 - Saved by His life, vs 10
 - Reconciled to God, vss 10-11
 - Rejoicing in God, v 11
