
Living a Godward Life (Part Two)

Romans 6:15 – 23

But thanks be to God, that you who were once slaves of sin have become obedient from the heart to the standard of teaching to which you were committed, and having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. – Romans 6:17 – 18

God's purpose in redeeming people from sin is not to give them freedom to do as they please but freedom to do as He pleases, which is to live righteously. When God commanded Pharoah to let His people go, He also made clear His purpose for their deliverance, 'that they may serve me' (Ex. 7:16). God delivers people from enslavement to sin for the sole purpose of their becoming enslaved to Him and to His righteousness. — John MacArthur

Introduction: Five Key Principles

- i. If we present ourselves as slave to any power, we become slaves of that power. (vs. 16)
- ii. There are only two ultimate powers: either obedience to sin or obedience to God. (vs. 16)
- iii. These two powers are entirely different and utterly opposed to each other. (vs. 19 22)
- iv. It is impossible to be slaves to both of these masters at the same time. (vs. 17 18)
- v. Our true master is revealed not by what we say, but by what we do. (vs. 20 23)
- A. The Question: Are we to sin because we are not under law but under grace? (vs. 15)

B. The Answer: Illustrated by the Obedience of a Slave (vs. 16 – 19)

C. The Irony of Being Slaves of God vs. the Shame of Being Slaves of Sin (vs. 19 – 23)
