Romans 8:18 - 30; 2 Corinthians 4:16 - 18

For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us... we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies. — Rom. 8:18, 23

So, we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal. – 2 Cor. 4:16 - 18

It is our unredeemed bodies which cause us to groan. Why is this? For one thing, these bodies are weak, fragile, and mortal, subject to fatigue, sickness, pain and death...what makes us groan inwardly is our physical frailty on the one hand, and our fallen nature on the other. So, we long ardently for the future glory, when we shall be delivered from both these burdens. – John Stott
