Introduction: We all have a distorted view of Greatness!

- 1. True Greatness is Child-like and Humble (Mt. 18:1 4)
- 2. <u>True Greatness is Forgiving and Merciful</u> (Mt. 18:15 35)
- 3. <u>True Greatness is Selfless and Serving</u> (Mt. 20:25 28)

<u>Conclusion:</u> Jesus is the Greatest of All! (Mt. 11:28 – 30; 18:21 - 35; 20:28)



## Discussion Questions:

- *i.* What is it about Jesus' teaching on true greatness that most baffles you?
- ii. What part of Jesus' teaching on true greatness is the most difficult to apply?
  - a. Being child-like and humble? (Mt. 18:1 4)
  - b. Being forgiving and merciful? (Mt. 18:15 35)
  - c. Being selfless and serving of others? (Mt. 20:25 28)
- iii. How do you identify with the disciples in this story?
- iv. How are followers of Jesus to stand out in today's world where promoting yourself is applauded and NOT doing so is seen as weakness or lack of confidence?

## Application:

Take one of the areas of true greatness from this outline and decide you will work on it this week: Child-like, humble, forgiving, merciful, selfless, serving of others.

Ask Jesus to give you an opportunity to let His grace of greatness shine through you.
