Truly I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things take place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away. But concerning that day and hour, no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only.

Matthew 24:34 – 36

If we are to understand the Biblical writers, we have to learn to read their language in their way...It is vital to read the passage as it would have been heard by Matthew's first audience. And there, it seems, we are back to the great crisis that was going to sweep over Jerusalem, and its surrounding countryside at a date that was, to them, in the unknown future, though we now know it happened in AD 70, at the climax of the war between Rome and Judea.

- 4. What is the most important lesson to remember in reading of the last days?
