

Peter Denies Knowing Jesus

Sunday, March 17, 2024 --- Matthew 26:57-75

Peter's denial of knowing Jesus often raises questions in our mind about Peter's loyalty to the Lord. It is perhaps worth noting that while everyone else fled, Peter still followed Jesus to the courtyard, albeit at a distance, but he did follow Jesus. Peter's denials were rooted in his self-confidence, his unpreparedness to respond, and his fear of people. Traits that all of us possess and often practice. The account of Peter's denials of Jesus is an unparallelled account of a colossal collapse of faith, but ultimately godly remorse that led to genuine repentance which resulted in divine restoration.
