Discussion Questions

- 1. Joseph faced a situation where every option seemed costly or painful.**
 - Have you ever felt “caught in a story you didn’t ask for”? What helped you stay faithful when the path ahead wasn’t clear?
- 2. Joseph chose compassion over vindication when he planned to divorce Mary quietly.**
 - What does this teach us about responding to situations where we feel wronged, misunderstood or hurt?
- 3. Joseph obeys God immediately and quietly - without recognition, applause, or clarity about the future.**
 - How does Joseph’s quiet obedience speak to the kinds of obedience God calls us to today? Where might God be asking you to take a faithful “next step” even without seeing the whole picture?
- 4. In Matthew 2, Joseph must take Mary and Jesus and flee to Egypt - becoming a refugee provider in a foreign land.**
 - How does this part of the story expand your understanding of the challenges Joseph faced? What encouragement can you draw from God’s protection and provision in this chapter?
- 5. Joseph’s weary journey shows that joy often breaks into ordinary faithfulness, not easy circumstances.**
 - Where in your life do you long to see God bring joy into a weary place? How can your group pray for you as you walk that journey?
