Life Group Discussion Questions:

1. “We can have a blurry picture of Jesus.”

What are some ways people today can unintentionally create a picture of Jesus that isn't consistent with the Jesus we meet in Scripture? What influences your own understanding of who Jesus is?

2. Luke wanted Theophilus to know the “certainty” of what he had been taught (Luke 1:4).

What gives you confidence that the story Luke tells us about Jesus is trustworthy? When have you experienced your confidence in Jesus strengthened by going deeper into Scripture?

3. Luke carefully investigated the story of Jesus so that people could know Him clearly.

Why do you think it's important to slow down and really *look* at Jesus rather than simply assuming we already know Him? Is there an aspect of Jesus you hope to see more clearly during this series?

4. “The greatest connection isn't with a ministry. The greatest connection is with Jesus.”

Our church is encouraging people to get connected and involved. What is the difference between being connected to a church and being genuinely connected to Christ? What might that look like in everyday life?
